

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OFFICE IN EVERY MUNICIPALITY, CITY AND PROVINCE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Information Technology is commonly used as a synonym for computers and computer networks, Wikipedia defines it as the application of computers and telecommunications equipment to store, retrieve, transmit and manipulate data. Simultaneous access by many users has made business processes productive and has increased efficiency in most transactions. The speed by which these data are stored, retrieved and transmitted has revitalized efficiency and productivity to a whole different level.

The advantages of a fully automated public service transaction, we believe, shall save time and transportation cost, limit bureaucratic red tape and curb corruption, as well as allow for government transparency and maximize efficiency and productivity of public functions. Some LGUs have already established far more advanced system of information technology in their locality and by this humble legislation, we wish that other LGUs shall likewise share in the benefits that automation has brought to the

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OFFICE IN EVERY MUNICIPALITY, CITY AND PROVINCE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SEC. 1. **Declaration of Policy** It is hereby declared to be the policy of the State to recognize the vital role of communication and information in nation-building. Towards this end, the automation of information and transactions in all municipality, city and province shall be organized and made accessible through a database management system to increase productivity and efficiency in public service.

 SEC. 2. **Information Technology Office** There shall be established an Information Technology Office in every municipality, city and province throughout the country which shall have the following objectives:

 a.To provide for the automation and system of electronic data storage for
- a. To provide for the automation and system of electronic data storage for all information and transactions relating to local business processes and other matters of public concern;
- b.To provide on-time accomplishment reports of all departments, local advisories and participatory initiatives for local programs;
 - c.To expedite the processing of all local transactions;

1	d.To provide for a technology that will offer online payments for all local
2	taxes, fees and other assessments;
3	e.To be equipped with accurate computation of payments;
4	f.To provide for transparency and the effective monitoring of all
5	information and transactions within the locality concerned;
6	g.To provide for consistent accessibility of organized information to the
7	general public as well as provide a venue for communication with
8	constituents;
9	h.To provide a productive tool to increase efficiency in local government
10	service;
11	i.To equip local government units with a constantly evolving technology
12	that will be at par with global standards.
13	SEC. 3. Budget and Implementation - The amount necessary for the
14	operation and maintenance of the Information Technology Office in every
15	municipality, city and province shall be charged to the local funds. The LGU
16	concerned, shall, immediately include in its annual budget the amount to be
17	defrayed, and, consistent with its allowable budgetary allocation may seek the
18	technological support of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) in
19	the establishment of the IT Office.
20	SEC. 4. Separability Clause If any portion or provision of this Act is
21	declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of
22	the other provisions hereof.
23	SEC. 5. Repealing Clause All laws, rules and regulations, other
