RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING THE SENSE OF THE SENATE TO NOMINATE RAMON REVILLA, SR. FOR THE NATIONAL ARTIST AWARD FOR FILM IN RECOGNITION OF HIS IMMENSE CONTRIBUTIONS TO PHILIPPINE CULTURE AND THE ARTS, SPECIFICALLY TO THE PHILIPPINE **ENTERTAINMENT INDUSTRY**

WHEREAS, Proclamation No. 1001 s. 1972, creating the National Artist

2	Award, is administered jointly by the Cultural Center of the Philippines and
3	the National Commission for Culture and the Arts and conferred by the
4	President of the Philippines through a Presidential Proclamation;
5	WHEREAS, the National Artist Award is the highest honor conferred to
6	Filipino Artists who have made distinct contributions to the fields of literature,
7	music, dance, theater, visual arts, film, broadcast arts, fashion design and
8	architecture, and the arts;
9	WHEREAS, the Order of National Artists aims to recognize:
10	1. Filipino artists who have made significant contributions to the
11	cultural heritage of the country;
12	2. Filipino artistic accomplishment at its highest level and to
13	promote creative expression as significant to the development of
14	a national cultural identity; and
15	3. Filipino artists who have dedicated their lives to their works to
16	forge new paths and directions for future generations of Filipino
17	artists;

WHEREAS, nominations for National Artist are based on the following criteria, as set forth by the Cultural Center of the Philippines and the National Commission for Culture and the Arts:

- 1. Living artists who are Filipino citizens at the time of the nomination, as well as those who died after the establishment of the award in 1972 but were Filipino citizens at the time of their death;
- 2. Artists who through the content and form of their works have contributed in building a Filipino sense of nationhood;
- 3. Artists who pioneered in a mode of creative expression or style, thus earning distinction and making an impact on succeeding generations of artists;
- 4. Artists who have created a substantial and significant body of works and/or consistently displayed excellence in the practice of their art form thus enriching artistic expression or style; and
- 5. Artists who enjoy broad acceptance through prestigious national and/or international recognition, critical acclaim and/or reviews of their works, and respect and esteem from peers;
- **WHEREAS,** Ramon Revilla, Sr. is a renowned entertainment icon, actor, producer, writer and director, and a public servant;
- **WHEREAS,** through the years, he has contributed immensely to the development of Philippine art;
- **WHEREAS,** his movies depicted not only the Filipino way of life, but also our unique culture and strong ideals;
- WHEREAS, he was a recipient of several notable awards which include the 1973 FAMAS Best Actor Award, the 1976 Outstanding Producer Award, the 1979 Most Outstanding Actor, and the Box Office King. In 2011, he received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Catholic Mass Media. Last July 1 during the *Luksang Parangal* held in his honor, Ramon Revilla, was acclaimed and conferred with the Sino-Phil Asia International Peace Award for Performing Arts;
- WHEREAS, aside from being recognized due to his distinguished achievements as an actor and a producer, Senator Ramon Revilla Sr. must be

1 commended for being a purveyor of quality and respectable Philippine

2 Entertainment Industry as warranted by his work for the advancement of

3 Philippine Motion Picture Industry and children's welfare under his capacity

as the Chairman of the Senate Committee on Motion Pictures and Television

5 in the 10th and 11th Congresses;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7356, otherwise known as the Law Creating the National Commission for Culture and the Arts, views "art" as something that "reflects and shapes values, beliefs, aspirations, thereby defining a people's national identity." This principle was fully realized when Senator Ramon Revilla Sr.'s authored bill, Republic Act No. 8370 or the Children's Media Act, was signed into law in 1997, with the objective of recognizing the vital role of the youth in nation-building and the influence of broadcast media, specifically television, in molding a child's intellectual, emotional and social well-being;

WHEREAS, Senator Ramon Revilla, Sr.'s contribution to Philippine society in general and to the Philippine entertainment in particular should not go unrecognized as he is a genuine gem who has contributed much to the proliferation and appreciation of the arts in our country;

WHEREAS, Senator Ramon Revilla, Sr. is an embodiment of talent, intelligence, and artistry that makes him befitting of the title of National Artist;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, AS IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE PHILIPPINES, to express to the National Commission for Culture and the Arts and the Cultural Center of the Philippines the sense of the Senate to nominate Ramon Revilla, Sr. for the National Artist Award for Film in recognition of his immense contributions to Philippine culture and the arts, specifically to the Philippine entertainment industry.
